

ENVIRONMENTAL POLICY

Mosaic Forest Management is committed to safe, sustainable, science-based forest management and will conduct its activities in a manner that maintains ecosystem health and function on the lands we manage and the waters we may affect.

- In addition to supporting this Policy, employees, consultants and contractors will meet all applicable compliance obligations and conform to relevant certification standards, including ISO 14001, Sustainable Forestry Initiative®, PEFC™ chain of custody, and CCAB Progressive Aboriginal Relations.
- The company will maintain policies that set environmental objectives and targets, with appropriate systems and sufficient resources to achieve the desired results.
- Forest management activities will be conducted in a manner that protects biological diversity, forest productivity and health, water quality, fish habitat, soil productivity, critical wildlife habitat, species at risk and special sites.
- Planners will incorporate cultural and social values such as culturally significant sites, recreational areas and aesthetic features in the planning process, in coordination with Indigenous Peoples, governments, and community stakeholders.
- Staff and contractors will make environmental protection a planning priority with a focus on preventing pollution, emergency preparedness and promoting responsible recycling and waste reduction.
- Managers will consider climate change in operations management and forest planning, and seek to mitigate the risk through reduced emissions, enhanced silviculture and forest carbon sequestration.
- Plans will contribute to the continuous improvement of the environmental management system and its performance through enhanced standards and practices, targeted investment, research, training, professional development and education.
- Management will make regular environmental performance reports publicly available.
