

## TIMBERWEST ENVIRONMENTAL POLICY

TimberWest is committed to safe, sustainable forest management and will conduct its activities in a manner that maintains fully functioning ecosystems.

- Employees and contractors are required to act in support of this policy and will comply with all applicable laws as well as conforming to relevant certification standards, including ISO 14001, Sustainable Forestry Initiative® and PEFC™ chain of custody.
- Managers will ensure that effective resources and systems for establishing and achieving environmental objectives and targets are in place to meet regulatory requirements, company policies, procedures and other commitments such as responsible fibre sourcing.
- Planners will work with government and other relevant parties to identify key public environmental and social values and will employ appropriate management practices for the protection of such values.
- Forest management activities will be conducted in a manner that protects biological diversity, forest health and the key environmental values of water quality, fish habitat, soil productivity, critical wildlife habitat, species at risk, special sites and respects cultural, recreation and aesthetic values.
- Environmental protection will be a planning priority and activities will be sensitive to local conditions, needs and values and strive to prevent pollution and promote responsible recycling, waste reduction and safe disposal of hazardous materials.
- Forestry operations will be managed with the objective of sustaining economically viable operations and continuously improving our environmental management system to enhance environmental performance through research, training, and education.
- Periodic performance reports will be made available to the public to demonstrate transparency.
